CONSUMER PRICE INDICES AND INFLATION RATES FOR DECEMBER 2019

Kenya National Bureau of Statistics hereby releases the monthly Consumer Price Indices (CPI) and rates of inflation, for December, 2019. These numbers were generated from a survey of retail prices that targeted a basket of household consumption goods and services. The exercise was conducted during the second and third weeks of the month, with prices being obtained from selected retail outlets in 25 data collection zones in Nairobi and in 13 other urban centers.

As shown in Tables 1 and 2, the CPI increased by 0.90 per cent from 202.94 in November 2019 to 204.77 in December 2019. The overall year on year inflation in December 2019 was 5.82 per cent.

The Food and Non-Alcoholic Drinks' Index increased by 1.46 per cent from November 2019 to December 2019. As shown in Table 3, the increase was mainly due to rise in prices of some foodstuffs outweighing decrease recorded in others. High increases of vegetables was recorded despite the ongoing heavy rains. For instance, prices of Kales (sukuma wiki), tomatoes, spinach and onions increased by 5.6, 7.8, 9.1 and 5.1 per cent, respectively, compared with the prices for the previous month. However, during the same period, prices of unpacketed fresh milk and mangoes dropped.

The Housing, Water, Electricity, Gas and Other Fuels' Index, increased marginally mainly attributed to higher prices of charcoal. However, the cost of electricity dropped slightly compared to the previous month.

Despite decrease in the pump prices of diesel and petrol during the month, the Transport Index increased by 2.1 per cent mainly as a result of increase in public transport fares.
