CONSUMER PRICE INDICES AND INFLATION RATES FOR MARCH 2015

Kenya National Bureau of Statistics hereby releases Consumer Price Indices (CPI) and inflation rates for March, 2015. These numbers have been generated using data collected during the second and third weeks of the month under review. The prices were obtained from selected retail outlets in 25 data collection zones located in 13 urban centers.

As shown in Tables 1 and 2, the CPI increased by 1.12 per cent from 154.14 in February 2015 to 155.86 in March 2015. The overall inflation rate stood at 6.31 per cent in March 2015.

Between February and March 2015, Food and Non-Alcoholic Drinks' Index increased by 2.65 per cent. This was mainly attributed to increases in the cost of vegetables, milk and other food products. The rise in prices was mainly as a result of the dry weather conditions experienced during the period. However, prices of sugar, maize flour and other food items dropped during the period under review.

Over the same period, Housing, Water, Electricity, Gas and Other Fuels' Index, eased by 0.05 per cent. As indicated in Table 3, there were falls in the cost of electricity and cooking gas.

During the same period, the Transport Index decreased by 0.33 per cent. This was due to a drop in public transport fares which outweighed the increase in the prices of diesel and petrol.
