CONSUMER PRICE INDICES AND INFLATION RATES FOR NOVEMBER 2015

Kenya National Bureau of Statistics hereby releases Consumer Price Indices (CPI) and inflation rates for November, 2015. These numbers have been generated using data collected during the second and third weeks of the month under review. The prices were obtained from selected retail outlets in 25 data collection zones located in Nairobi and 13 other urban centers.

As shown in Tables 1 and 2, the CPI increased by 0.52 per cent from 162.13 in October 2015 to 162.97 in November 2015. The overall inflation rate stood at 7.32 per cent in November 2015.

Between October and November 2015, Food and Non-Alcoholic Drinks' Index increased by 1.08 per cent. This aggregate increase in the food index was a result of rise in prices of several food items which outweighed the decreases.

Over the same review period, Housing, Water, Electricity, Gas and Other Fuels' Index, decreased by 0.13 per cent. As indicated in Table 3 above, this aggregate decrease was mainly due to cost decreases in electricity, kerosene and cooking gas. The cost of consuming 50 and 200 KWh of electricity for instance decreased by 9.4 and 6.1 per cent respectively, mainly on account lower forex adjustment charges in November compared to October 2015.

The Transport Index decreased by 0.37 per cent in November 2015 compared to the previous month. This was mainly attributed to decreases in the cost of petrol and diesel.
