









02 ECONOMIC PERFORMANCE

Real Gross Domestic Product (GDP) grew by 5.6% in 2023 compared to a revised growth of 4.9% in 2022, mainly driven by rebound in agricultural activities that contracted in 2022.






Commercial Banks' and Non-bank Financial Institutions Bills, Loans and Advances to the private Sector, 2023




Exports grew to KSh 1,007.9 billion (15.4%) from increased revenues from horticultural products and tea while imports increased to KSh 2,612.0 billion.








Energy Supply (%)

Imports of Petroleum Products (Million Tonnes)







Kenya Tourism Sector Performance in 2023











ICT Sector Output (2019 - 2023)




Types of Online Crime Reported


Expenditure for the Education Sector (KSh Billions – 2019/20 – 2023/24)


